OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Sharon Jackson, known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

Learning Journeys This Term



Before things started to get a little festive in YR, the reception children were visited by none other than Supertato himself! Luckily they managed to track down the Evil Pea, build Lego traps and teach him lessons on how to be kind! The children discussed their own super powers and created super fruits and veggies too.



Year 2 started this half term by looking at significant people in history. We focussed on Rosa Parks, looking at racism and diversity and the stand that she made on the bus that influenced many of the changes in society. We completed the half term by creating our own cartoon creations. Additionally, we looked at the history of cartoons and finished the term with creating their own Christmas minion



In Year 4, the children have been exploring our 'Fragile Planet'. We have studied climate change and the impact that plastic pollution has. Our class book '*The Last Bear*' linked to this learning journey and we all fell in love with a polar bear who needed to find his way home despite the melting ice caps. The children have also been discovering the science of sound in our learning journey 'Good Vibrations' where we have studied the difference between pitch and volume and written some amazing poetry which sounded great to the ear.



Year 1 have been focussing on being colourful & creative. The entire learning journey has been centred around 'The Day The Crayons Quit'. The children have also been focussing on writing letters to Duncan and have been discovering what primary colours are. They have also experimented with colour mixing and tinting. We're very proud of them!



Year 3 have been busy this term completing two separate learning journeys. We started the half term off by learning about 4 different books. The children completed lots of story writing and different pieces of art, including a multimedia piece involving the iPads. We then moved onto magnets & forces, where the children explored the strength of magnets and compared magnetic and non-

magnetic materials.



Year 5 started off this term with 'The Explorer'. The children had the wonderful opportunity of making and tasting chilli and rice & guacamole and salsa. We then created our own vectors in ICT, which led on to designing and creating their own chocolate bars. Alongside this, they produced beautiful poems about sloths. Following this, we started to read 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and we have produced some fabulous artwork. The children learned all about earthquakes and volcanoes. After this, the children then conducted their own scientific experiments and have produced fantastic travel brochures for Japan.



Year 6 have been learning the art of business through the Enterprise learning journey. They've been working in teams to produce different products in preparation for their Enterprise selling week. They've mastered the skills of being successful business people.
