OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Sharon Jackson, known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

The children became stand up comedians! Many of the children recorded videos of themselves at home telling some very funny jokes which were compiled together and shown in assembly.


Alongside this, there was a designing competition where some winning designs from Reception, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 were printed professionally onto t-shirts.








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Learning Journeys This Term



Year Reception have been Around the World this half term, travelling to different continents each week with a key focus on major countries within. They have learned some different languages, looked at varied climate zones, identified the animals that were present and have completed some non-fiction writing. Alongside this, the children created their own passports and took to the skies on Kirby airlines.



Year 2's learning journey this half term is titled Come Rain or Shine, where the children have investigated different climate zones and the weathers associated with them. Their writing has been centred around Lila and the Secret of the Rain by David Conway and Jude

Daly. They have made predictions on what is going to happen, planned a diary entry in Lila's perspective and had a go at writing



In Year 4, the children have been on a North American Road Trip. The children started by looking at all of the continents, the states of USA and different climate zones. Following this, the children compared some major cities within North America, focusing on New York where the children recreated Keith Harris' signature style. Next, they looked at Canadian animals and created their own classification key to help sort different animals. They also designed their own totem poles and made totem pole stories based on

these.




Year 1 have been pondering the question "Who Lives in a Place like this?" where they have learned about Kirby Muxloe and the different buildings and houses that preside within the village. They have also been on a walk to Kirby Castle which gave them the opportunity to explore the local area. In addition, they've extended their horizons and learned about children's lives in different
