The trip also gave opportunities for those who may not have experienced this environment or type of activity before • Sports Coach used to encourage and increase participation in physical activity at playtimes • We are proud to have offered swimming lessons as early as Year 1 which enables the children to have more confidence as they progress and achieve national standards before they leave school in Year 6 • Outside providers provided specialised teaching to increase participation in sports we have not previously offered • Children had the chance to take part in dance sessions linked to our whole school Shakespeare week with dance choreographers • Children in Years 5 and 6 worked on rugby skills with coaches from Leicester Tigers <p>Links to Sports Premium Targets: 1, 4</p>

Our aim was to give as many children as possible the chance to experience competitive sport. Membership of HBSPANN helped to facilitate this. This meant that a higher percentage of children were able to compete in out of school activities and more opportunities were given to KS2 year groups to take part in out of school events. This meant we were able to familiarise pupils with representing KMPS in an unfamiliar environment, working on behaviour, communication and specialised sporting skills. • Transport costs being covered meant that organisation of events was easier, reducing workload for staff. Also, we increased the feeling of team work and togetherness through travelling as a group, as well as meaning more children were able to participate as transport wasn't an issue. • Cover for staff and sports day coaches meant that better relationships between staff and pupils were formed. • New goal posts purchased to enable us to host competitive football matches and events <p>Links to Sports Premium Targets: 1, 4, 5</p>

Children were familiar with the style of PE lessons right from the beginning of term and staff were able to build on their knowledge and apply new skills after each training session. New staff were given Real PE training to ensure consistency and high quality delivery throughout the school. Staff were given further training in Real Gym and Real Dance as we look to further enrich our PE curriculum Regular monitoring of lesson delivery through informal observations and discussions at staff meeting ensured consistency of delivery and feedback showed that Real PE is fully embedded into our PE curriculum and continued to ensure staff confidence in the scheme. <p>Links to Sports Premium Targets: 1, 3</p>
