

Merry Christmas everyone!




Talk the Talk - Year 6

Research found that 33% of girls aged 11-16 reported playing football at secondary school compared with 63% of boys and this is a considerable drop compared with primary aged children where 54% of girls aged 7-10 compared to 80% of boys play football.



We have got some tricks that we would like you to try over the Christmas holidays.

Step Over - Put your foot around the ball in both directions with both feet. Toe Taps - Put your left and right foot in turn quickly on the ball and tap it.
