OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Sharon Jackson, known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.



Learning Journeys This Half Term



Reception have been learning all about super heroes. The classroom was invaded by The Evil Pea and wrote rules to help him. They have also been very lucky to have not one, but three special visitors, who kindly came in to school to tell the children all about their fantastic, front-line jobs.



This term Year 2 have explored continents and oceans as pirates, looking specifically at Madagascar (Pirate's Island). We investigated to see what the pirates would have seen and found on the island, using atlases & compass points. We made a treasure map with key geographical features added in a key. We looked at forces, finishing off with an investigation looking at how distance effects sound.



Year 4 have been learning all about 'Law and Order'. We have been thinking about what makes a good leader, why we have rules and how we vote and elect our leaders. We were also paid a visit by our local councillor, Roger Stead! We have also been designing a healthy and balanced meal with a little bit of advice from our school cook, Helen who answered lots of our questions!



In Year One's learning journey 'Unity in the Community' we learned about all the different communities each of us is part of. We've been on a walk around the village and identified lots of local landmarks and types of houses. We've also been learning all about plants; their different parts, what they need to grow and which



Year 3 have been focusing on the Ancient Greeks this half term. We've started by looking at the differences between Athens and Sparta, examining some of their conflicts. Following this, we analysed Ancient Greek vases (and created our own!) which gave an insight into what daily life & beliefs were like in Ancient Greece. We finished the half term by starting play rehearsals for our play!









In Year 5, we have been learning about conflict through the lens of the Roman Civilisation. From acting out Roman conflict conversations to creating our very own mosaics, we have been busy developing our understanding of what it was like to live as a Roman.







War of the Worlds has taken us on a journey of exploration and investigation. We created some incredible presentations about the initial causes of World War 1 and World War 2. We then began to explore how we see! We looked at the biological make up on the eye and made incredible information leaflets based on all aspects of light. We ended the Learning Journey with an art project based on our current literacy book - The Ways of the Wolf. The children explored different mediums, textures and layers to create some truly beautiful pieces of abstract art.
